The peaceful death of Rose Marie Hordos (nee Molnar), 84 years, of Cupar and District Nursing Home and formerly of Lanigan and Raymore, occurred on Sunday, April 4, 2021.

Rose Marie was born in Ontario on May 4, 1936. When she was two years old, she and her two brothers were adopted by Julius and Mary Molnar. She very much enjoyed her time there and all of the activities and people to visit with.
