**Sept. 6, 1923 - May 23, 2021**  
 Dorothy Irene Davidson (née Thompson) passed away May 23, 2021 at the age of 97 at the Central Parkland Lodge in Lanigan, Sask. She was born on the Thompson farm west of Lanigan to Lorne and Addie (née Marshall) Thompson. She was the third youngest of nine children.

When Dorothy met Clarence she was employed as a bank teller in Viscount, Sask. and later in Moose Jaw. The two wrote letters to each other while Clarence worked hard to convert a granary into their first home. Weekend trips by train and their many letters kept them going until they were married in 1945. They had two daughters, Sandra and Lois.

They lived on the Davidson homestead, sharing the yard with Clarence's parents, William and Phoebe. Clarence farmed with his brother George. Dorothy helped care for the large farmyard and gardens. They shared a love for music and dancing. Dorothy sang and played piano; Clarence played saxophone and along with various other players over the years, formed a small dance band, playing for weddings and parties. They enjoyed camping and fishing and Dorothy was a master at filleting. Dorothy and Clarence took many motor home trips, making new friends and revisiting old ones, including several winters in Mesa, Arizona, and annual trips to B.C. in fruit season. Dorothy remained close to all her siblings and was blessed to have sisters Wilda, Rhoda and Jeanne living and raising their families in the Lanigan area. Dorothy was always involved in her community, a member of the United Church, the church choir, Merry Mixers Seniors group, local exercise classes and many more organizations over the years. Dorothy continued to play after Clarence's passing, joining friends Bud Gunther and Jack Robson, entertaining at local events and seniors' residences. And for as long as she was able, she played piano for after-supper sing-alongs at the lodge.

She cherished and is cherished by her only grandchild, Kate.

Clarence and Dorothy were predeceased by their eldest daughter Sandra in 1971. Clarence passed away in 1993, and Dorothy continued to live on the farm until she moved to Lanigan in 2000 and to Central Parkland Lodge in 2018.

Dorothy was predeceased by her parents, her husband Clarence, daughter Sandra, and all of her siblings and their spouses: Mabel Quiring (Hank), Wilda Gunther (Walter), Jack (Gertie Johns), Elmer (in infancy), Bert (Ellen Johns), Rhoda Greve (Herbert), Edna Maze (Jack) and Jeanne Rucks (Alfred), her brother-in-law, George Davidson, sister-in-law Molly Paulson (Edgar), and Clarence's cousin and their close neighbour, Grant Davidson (Anne). She is missed and remembered by her daughter, Lois Davidson, son-in-law, Douglas Blackport and his mother, Gudrun Blackport, her beloved granddaughter, Kate Blackport (Lee Vermeulen), her sister-in-law, Edna Davidson, and many much loved nieces, nephews and friends.

### Attempted murder charges laid

Three people have been charged with attempted murder following a nearly eight-month long investigation. Investigators believe there may be other victims of similar incidents by the charged individuals identified below.

On the morning of Oct. 4, 2020, Fort Qu'Appelle EMS and RCMP responded to a call of an injured person who was located in a rural field north of Fort Qu'Appelle. The victim had suffered severe injuries requiring hospital treatment.

The investigation, led by the Regina RCMP General Investigation Section, involved the assistance of many RCMP Detachments and RCMP support units, the Saskatoon Police Service and Regina Police Service. The investigation determined the victim met three suspects outside of a nightclub in Regina and left in a vehicle with them. The victim was beaten, tortured and robbed. The suspects attempted to access the victim's bank account. The victim was then taken to a field outside of Fort Qu'Appelle, further beaten and left unconscious. Hours later a passerby saw the victim and called 911.

On Nov. 5, 2020, a search warrant was executed at a residence in Wadena in relation to this investigation. Sheridan Squirrel and Jenna Hoffman of Wadena were arrested and charged with attempted murder, kidnapping, robbery and choking to overcome resistance. Both made their first court appearance in Regina Provincial Court in November 2020. On Mar. 16, 2021, as part of a plea agreement, Sheridan Squirrel plead guilty to aggravated assault, robbery and forcible confinement and was sentenced to five and a half years in jail. Jenna Hoffman remains in custody awaiting trial. Her next court appearance is June 17, 2021 in Regina Provincial Court.

On May 20, 2021 Austin Severight of Yellowquill First Nation was charged with attempted murder, kidnapping,

robbery and choking to overcome resistance. On May 25, 2021 he was arrested in Tisdale and made his first court appearance on May 27, 2021 in Regina Provincial Court. His next court appearance was June 1, 2021 in Provincial Court in Regina.

Investigators believe there may be other victims of similar incidents by the charged individuals. If you are a victim, we encourage you to report any information you have to your nearest police service or call Crime Stoppers and report anonymously (1-800-222-8477).

### Canada Road Safety Week

May 18 to 24, 2021 was Canada Road Safety Week and Saskatchewan RCMP Traffic Services officers were on the roads enforcing safety rules and removing dangerous drivers from behind the wheel.

During the week long enforcement campaign, Traffic Services officers gave 1,519 warnings, laid 10 impaired charges, and issued nine roadside suspensions, 972 speeding tickets, 78 distracted driving tickets, 84 seatbelt tickets and 204 vehicle defect inspection notices.

### Men found safe after spending night in forest north of Kamsack

On Friday, May 28, 2021, a 65-year-old male and a 73-year-old male travelled to the Porcupine Forest north of Kamsack. At 9:42 p.m. the wife of one of those males received a text message that their ATV had broken down and they were trying to return on foot. At approximately 1:30 a.m., Fort Qu'Appelle and Kamsack RCMP were called for assistance in locating them.

RCMP officers, along with Saskatchewan Ministry of Environment Conservation Officers, Duck Mountain Ambulance Care Norquay Division and local volunteers aided in search efforts. The men were located at approximately 12:15 p.m. The men were healthy, but tired.
