On March 28, 1913, Lilly Schroeder was born the fourth of 11 children to John and Sophie Schroeder in Thalberg, Man. The family later moved to the Jansen area. She attended the Illinois and Auderville schools completing her education after seventh grade. She said that she liked school and enjoyed teasing the teachers on occasion. Lilly accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her Saviour at age 16 and was baptized in the Jansen Lake age 21. At age 26, Lilly married Karl Seifert. They had two daughters, Judy and Fern, five grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. Making their first home near LeRoy, they eventually bought a farm in the Lanigan area and after three years there, moved to a farm near Jansen where they remained until their retirement. During her time on the farm, Lilly loved gardening, sewing, milking cows and raising animals. She also cooked, canned and baked. In more recent years she took up crocheting toques, donating hundreds of them to seafarers docking at a mission in Nainimo, B.C. Lilly loved to read her Bible each day. Another very important part of her spiritual life was singing hymns and memorizing scripture, a practice that she continued until the last few days of her life here on earth. We as a family were extremely blessed by her daily prayers for us. When Lilly was 100 years old, she was asked how she defined success. Her answer was, "Success is introducing people to Christ by sharing the Gospel in whatever way available and using the money He has entrusted to us to get the job done."
